With an excellent day school, Lander Grinspoon Academy, and newly developed resources for creating a vibrant Jewish community of the future, like Abundance Farm at CBI, our town is attracting more and more observant Jews, both Orthodox and liberal, especially younger Jews who are or will soon be starting families. Creating an Eruv to allow Sabbath-observant Jews to carry will help the community grow even more, and will strengthen Jewish life for everyone by making Northampton a magnet for educated and committed Jewish households.
